#### Dear Parent/Carer,

Our Lady's Catholic College is committed to educating young people about online safety and healthy relationships. We know it is crucial to alert them to the risks of online behaviour, exploitative relationships, and ensure they know where to get help if they need it. As a Catholic school it is important that we teach about relationships in the context of the Church's teaching about the human dignity of every person.

Online Safety Week starts on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> February 2021 it is very important to our school and students. Safer Internet Day is coordinated by the Insafe network and is celebrated every year across Europe, and in other countries worldwide. In the UK, Safer Internet Day is organised by the UK Safer Internet Centre (<a href="www.saferinternetday.org.uk">www.saferinternetday.org.uk</a>), and this year's theme is "An internet we trust: exploring reliability in the online world".

Young people are spending more time in lockdown online than any other time; remote learning, gaming, streaming and using social media. We want to encourage them to be using safe online behaviour and consider what they are seeing and reading online; is reliable. Thanks to Donald Trump we have heard about "Fake News"; but do we really know what it is?

Normally students would have special assemblies, activities and lessons in school but this year we need to do things a little differently.

We will be using our online platforms (Teams, Facebook & website) to celebrate and promote Online Safety Week. We encourage you and all our students to get involved. There will be activities, quizzes, competitions, student assemblies and parent information sessions. All our departments will also have an online safety focus in the normal lessons.

The Computing Department, who are CEOP trained, will be leading online safety week and we will be using films and resources that have been produced by CEOP and UK Safer Internet Centre. CEOP is part of the National Crime Agency, and its role is to protect children from sexual exploitation and abuse. **Please note:** films and resources shown/used are age/content appropriate.

We would encourage you to discuss the assemblies and lessons during this time as part of an ongoing conversation about their use of technology and safety.
