Catholic Life of the School

Every pupil will have the opportunity to experience the living God, and all members of the community will understand that the Gospel drives all our decisions. Our students will experience high quality prayer and liturgy led by staff who are confident to be faith witnesses in our school.

Pupils will have a developed sense of service, recognise that this is faith in action, and have multiple opportunities to experience it. Gospel values will be used regularly to lead action that benefits others in our school or local community.

The Gospels and Jesus's example will inspire and motivate pupils to make good decisions which will help them in their lives both in and out of school.

We will let 'our light shine' - our pupils will be confident to proclaim their faith in words and actions and their good works will be seen in the local area, encouraging even more families to choose to join Our Lady's community.

Pastoral

We will continue to ensure our students are in a safe environment, particularly the most vulnerable members of our school community. All staff across the school will have responsibility for the pastoral care of our pupils.

We will show compassion, empathy and forgiveness by living out our gospel values.

We will engage positively with parents and will have evolved and adapted our practices to ensure we are always working in the best interests of the student. We will communicate clearly and regularly within a reasonable and proportionate timescale.

We will offer opportunities for wider development not just in faith but through a rich extracurricular offer of lunchtime and after school clubs.

Staff

Our staff will continue to be empowered and supportive of school, they will promote and live our Catholic values.

We will have developed middle leaders to promote the focus and understanding of our aims and objectives.

We will have created a healthy balance of support and accountability.

We will have effective signposting in place through improved policies, procedures and communication.

We will have identified areas of improvement and encouraged active and participative CPD. Alongside this we will have created an environment where staff are confident to reflect, self-evaluate and select their own requirements of professional development.

Governors
