Dear Parents/Carers,

The end of another academic year is rapidly approaching and I want to share with you some of the highlights from our wonderful school community. The year has been a very busy one and I know that all the students have taken up many of the opportunities presented to them, both in the classroom and beyond.

The exam season is finally over and we have waved goodbye to Year 11s and Year 13s, though the majority of the Year 11s will return to Sixth Form in September. We are optimistic that the hard work of all the students will bear fruit and that on results days in August we will have many happy, smiling faces. The Key Stage 5 results will open doors for our Year 13s to university courses, further training or apprenticeships. We wish them all well. They have enriched our school community and we will miss them but have told them all they will always be a part of the Our Lady's family and to stay in touch.

Beyond the classroom there have been a large number of trips. Students have been to France, Liverpool, The Imperial War Museum, The Lake District, Blackpool Pleasure Beach and many more.
