




Spacious, well-equipped Art studios which are also available during some of your Study Periods for independent work.











You will follow the AQA A Level Art course – we usually offer Fine Art & Textiles endorsements.

This is 60% coursework & 40% exam.

The exam is all practical (similar to GCSE). You will have from 1st February to prepare and have 15 hours to complete your final outcome at the beginning of May.

Besides annotating your work the only written element is one 1500 to 3000 word essay connecting your own work to your chosen artists.

EXPERIMENTAL DRAWING TASK

You will need: Black felt tip pen / marker Paper / Tracing paper (bigger the better, if you don't have tracing paper you could use greaseproof paper or excess packing paper out of parcels, chip paper – be imaginative! Your phone with music on (or other source of music)

Task:

Select and play a piece of music from your phone. Make marks in response to the music – if the music was a mark what would it look like.

Repeat with different music.

If using tracing paper or similar you can lay them over each other to create different compositions.
