FIVE STUDENTS COMPLETE THEIR SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION



TAKING OUR FAITH IN ACTION GROUP TO ST. WALBURGE'S AND LADYEWELL




Year 12 Day with a Difference

They are going to have a day in the city with James Trewby (from the Columban Missionaries), Ben, Mrs. Bates and Mr. Cloke, trying to gain the support of local businesses for the campaign!


