Daniel, one of our GIFT Team members, read out the Gospel of the day and we listened to a piece of music called "Simeon's Song" - based on the Nunc Dimittis, then finished with a closing prayer. 

Catholic Ethos Afternoon

EXPLORING THE THREE PILLARS
OF LENT

As we are approaching Lent, Mrs. Seddon (with a little bit of help from Ben and Mr. Bird) led a Catholic Ethos session for our staff, exploring what Lent is, what the three pillars of Lent are, and what opportunities there are in school to make the most of this wonderful season.

Mrs. Seddon introduced us to "A Lenten Prayer" by William Ward (which you can read some of in the margin to the right), and helped us reflect on how we can lead our students in fasting from vices so that we can encourage them to grow in virtue - as our new mission statement encourages us to do! We also looked at the opportunities for prayer in school for staff and students: Mass, Adoration, Rosary, and Stations of the Cross will be on offer to help us grow in our prayer life with God.







We then looked at our almsgiving (charity) focus for Lent: the Uganda Project. We saw how our six partner schools and one health clinic have benefitted from the project already, and what this year's appeal has helped and will help with too. Picture 1 on the left shows the bore-hole being funded by the project for St. Mary's Primary School in Shagasha, allowing them to have a clean water supply on site, instead of walking 1km each way to a nearby stream. Picture 3 shows new bunk beds for the same school, so that they no longer have to sleep on a concrete floor. Picture 4 shows a STEM centre for St. Joseph's Secondary School in Rubuguri, built so that their students can gain valuable practical experience in STEM subjects, to help with lack of practical skills in students, which is a common barrier to employment in Uganda. Thanks to the generous support of the Turing Scheme, all transport and accommodation costs of the Uganda Trip are covered, so every penny raised by the Uganda Project goes straight to the Ugandan communities we serve and, as you can see, is having an invaluable impact on the lives of so many people.
